This is the consolidated list of agreed additions and updates for Issue 48 of the ONIX for Books codelists, as circulated to and agreed by the ONIX natonal groups. ¹

This issue includes a number of additions and revisions to provide futher details of some non-book products that are commonly traded within the book supply chain, particularly board games.

23	Game players	Number of players, for board games, card games, videogames etc. <productformfeaturevalue> must be a required (exact) number as an integer, OR a range (eg '2–6'), optionally accompanied by the number of players as text (eg 'suitable for 2–6 players') stated in <productformfeaturedescription>. For use in ONIX 3.0 only</productformfeaturedescription></productformfeaturevalue>
24	Game play time	Typical time to complete a game, for board games, card games, videogames <i>etc</i> , stated as an integer (in minutes) OR range (<i>eg</i> '60–90') in <productformfeaturevalue>, optionally accompanied by the playing time as text (<i>eg</i> 'typically 60–90 minutes') stated in <productformfeaturedescription>. For use in ONIX 3.0 only</productformfeaturedescription></productformfeaturevalue>

These additions enable the use of ONIX to describe many types of games (*eg* board games, role-playing games *etc*) which form an increasing part of the product mix in the supply chain. There may be further additions for this purpose in future codelist issues.

PJ	Postcard book or pack	Including greeting cards and packs. For bound books (usually with perforated sheets to remove cards), may use <productformdetail> codes P201 to P204 to specify binding</productformdetail>

Code	Label	Note
05	Carries other text associated with toy safety	Exact text (not in itself a warning) must be included in <productformfeaturedescription>. May be used either without any warning, or as text additional to a warning. Note that if no warnings apply, code 00 can provide positive indication of this. Example uses: 'Suitable for all ages' or 'Adult supervision required'</productformfeaturedescription>
08	Carries 'Conforms to EN71' statement	If specific alternative wording is carried in <productformfeaturedescription>, this must be used in place of the default 'Conforms to EN71' text. For use in ONIX 3.0 only</productformfeaturedescription>

25	Use of color	For readers with color vision deficiency, use of color (eg in diagrams) is not the sole means of graphical distinction
26	Use of contrast	Body text is presented with a contrast ratio of at least 4.5:1, or 3:1 for large/heading text

<u>List 243 – Dangerous goods regulations</u>

Code	Label	Note
01	GHS	Indicates if the product is generally classed as a hazardous substance. <productformfeaturedescription> must contain a Hazard Class [eg "Irritant (Category 2)"] using the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals (http://www.unece.org/fileadmin /DAM/ trans/danger/publi/ghs/ghs_rev08/ST-SG-AC10-30-Rev8e.pdf — Annex 1 contains a list of hazard classes and categories). The text is usually available on the Safety Data Sheet, along with equivalent GHS Hazard Pictograms, and may also be on the product or packaging. Must be accompanied by a Safety Data Sheet URL (see code 06), and is usually accompanied by one or more of codes 02—05 listing the specific chemlcal hazard</productformfeaturedescription>
02	Transport	Indicates the product is classed as a hazardous substance for transportation purposes. <productformfeaturedescription> must contain a 'UN number' (or UNID, 'UN' plus four digits from the list of at http://www.unece.org/fileadmin/DAM/trans/danger/publi/unrec/ English/index.pdf) specifying the specific chemical hazard, eg UN1203 is gasoline</productformfeaturedescription>
03	Storage	Indicates the product is classed as a hazardous substance for storage purposes. <productformfeaturedescription> must contain a 'UN number' (or UNID, 'UN' plus four digits from the list of at http://www.unece.org/fileadmin/DAM/trans/danger/publi/unrec/English/index.pdf) specifying the specific chemical hazard, eg UN1203 is gasoline</productformfeaturedescription>
04	Waste	Indicates the product is classed as a hazardous substance for disposal purposes. <productformfeaturedescription> must contain a 'UN number' (or UNID, 'UN' plus four digits from the list of at http://www.unece.org/fileadmin/DAM/trans/danger/publi/unrec/English/index.pdf) specifying the specific chemical hazard, eg UN1203 is gasoline</productformfeaturedescription>
05	Other	Indicates the product is classed as a hazardous substance for purposes not covered by other codes. <productformfeaturedescription> must contain a 'UN number' (or UNID, 'UN' plus four digits from the list of at http://www.unece.org/fileadmin/DAM/trans/danger/publi/unrec/English/ index.pdf) specifying the specific chemical hazard, eg UN1203 is gasoline. Must be accompanied by a Safety Data Sheet URL (see code 06)</productformfeaturedescription>
