

ONIX for Books codelists Issue 60

This is the consolidated list of agreed additions and updates for Issue 60 of the ONIX for Books codelists. This set of proposals was circulated for comment to the ONIX national groups, modified where necessary following feedback, and ratified by the ONIX International Steering Committee before publication.

Some of these additions fill out the list of language *groups*, for use when ONIX does not include a code for a *specifc* language. For example, in addition to contemporary Japanese itself (for which the existing ONIX code jpn should be used), the new code jpx includes medieval Old Japanese, Okinawan and other languages of the Ryukyu islands that do not have their own ONIX codes.
